REFLECTION FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The way that God works is doing extraordinary things through ordinary people. Jesus himself was the son of a carpenter; Peter and many of the apostles were fishermen; Paul was a tentmaker. I looked at some Census data this week that revealed that Holy Family Parish is made up of 49.4% 'blue collar' workers - just the sort of people that Jesus loved to work with. I think God does extraordinary things through these people because they are more open to their own frailties and fears, they know more about their need to trust in God and let God's grace into their life.

Even very ordinary things like Salt and Light can speak powerfully of God. Until very modern times salt was an essential for food preservation. You would not survive the long winter without preserving food from the harvest. Salt gives added flavour to what we eat. God can help preserve us for the darkness of our own winters and can add rich flavour to our spiritual life.

Light is an escape from darkness. Light helps us to see what is hidden. A candle can be used to light other candles without being diminished itself. God's love for

us, our love for others does not diminish us but helps us to grow stronger. God helps us to see what is hidden and to take away the fear of darkness.

This is only some of the rich symbolism of salt and light that Jesus alludes to with these images. They reveal much about the work of God in our lives and the world.



UPDATE: REGARDING CORONAVIRUS

The World Health Organisation has declared a public health emergency for the Coronavirus.

As a result of this declaration, and also advice from the NSW Health Department, the following directions have been made for the Celebration of Mass within the Diocese of Parramatta:

- Communion of the Precious Blood will NOT be distributed. It will be for the priest only.
- For the time being, Priests/ Deacons are not to invite parishioners to exchange the Greeting of Peace.
- All ministers of Holy Communion, are to ensure that they use hand sanitiser before the distribution of Holy Communion commences.

These measures will be reviewed in due course and when advice is received that the threat of the virus has receded, and the emergency declaration has lifted, you will be advised accordingly, and the measures will be reversed.

POPE FRANCIS turns 19th Century PALACE into a HOMELESS SHELTER

Palazzo Migliori, which was constructed in the early 1800s, served as the headquarters of the all-female Calasanziane religious order, which used the building to care for young single mothers. After occupying the building for 70 years, the order relocated to new premises last year and the palace was renovated, leading to questions about how it would be used. Sitting on prime real estate just off St Peter's Square, the building could have generated significant income for the Church as a luxury hotel, but Pope Francis had other intentions.

According to Vatican News, Pope Francis personally directed his almoner, Cardinal Konrad Krajewski (his officer in charge of distributing services to the poor), to convert it into a homeless shelter. The four-storey building will house around 50 men and women, although the 16-bedroom facility has capacity for more during cold winter temperatures, Cardinal Krajewski said.

The lower levels will be used to provide social support to the occupants, including computing, reading, recreation, and psychological counselling.

Volunteers can also use the building to prepare meals for homeless people who were sheltering elsewhere.

Cardinal Krajewski said the Vatican requested the construction company in charge of renovating the building employ homeless people during the overhaul. Andrea Riccardi, founder of Rome-based Catholic association Community of Sant'Egidio, which will run the shelter, said all people should be welcomed by the Vatican

"The important thing is that here we are in front of the Vatican, within the heart of the Pope, the poor have a home in front of the Pope," he said.

Pope Francis blessed the venue in November and dubbed it "A Palace for the Poor", just ahead of World Day of the Poor on November 17.


