REFLECTION FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

Pentecost Sunday


Something that we know about change that happens in our life is that it does not come easily or smoothly, and often it is associated with trauma, and we enter into it reluctantly. That certainly describes this current time of COVID-19 pandemic. But this can also be an opportunity for growth and change for our Church.

I am re-reading Pope Francis' *Evangelii Gaudium* at the moment, wanting to find insights into his vision of the Church in these difficult times. One image that has become famous is: "I prefer a Church which is bruised, hurting and dirty because it has been on the streets, rather than a Church which is unhealthy from being confined and from clinging to its own security." [49] This is a good place to start our thinking on Pentecost.

To go out, we need to have a message to bring with us. That message must come from a "renewed personal encounter with Christ", daily [3]. But the Gospel message must have a real effect in our lives, it is not about lip-service to God. [179]. The Gospel should change us. At the end of the Easter journey, it is a good time to ask how this "renewed personal encounter with Christ" is progressing? Are we closer to Christ now than when the COVID-19 pandemic began? Are we finding time daily to notice and relate to Christ?

Yes, our personal encounter with Christ comes in weakness through our own sin; yes, it is packaged within a faulty Church institution; but, it is also guided by the Spirit of life. However flawed we are as individuals and as the institution of the Church, "the Church must be a place of mercy freely given, where everyone can feel welcomed, loved, forgiven and encouraged to live the good life of the Gospel." [114]. We do not have this Church yet, but that is

the role of the Spirit to move us ever closer.

FIRST READING: Acts 2:1-11

The Spirit comes to the Apostles as tongues of fire.

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house when they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in their own language. Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and converts, Cretans and Arabs—in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power."

For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit we were all baptised into one body—Jews or Greek, slaves or free—and we were all made to drink of one Spirit.

May Spirit's patient endurance be yours while you wait for what is unknown to be revealed.


May the steady flame of Spirit's goodness within you convince you every day the power of your presence with others.

•The church doors will open for private prayer:


Monday to Friday: 8.30am—4.30pm

Celebration of 50 years of the Promulgation of the Rite of Consecrated Virginity on Pentecost 2020

On the 31st May 2020, on the feast of Pentecost, consecrated virgins from around the world will celebrate 50 years since the restoration of this ancient vocation and associated ritual (rite) of consecrated virginity.

In response to the rapid growth of the vocation, bishops in the early Church formalised consecrated virginity with a short rite in a solemn Eucharistic gathering. It became the first celibate vocation for women.

Since the promulgation in 1970 by Pope Paul VI, consecrated virginity has flourished where religious life has declined sharply. The vocation continues to grow rapidly in Europe and North, Central and South America and parts of Africa.



Today, consecrated virgins are bound by a special bond of love and mutual belonging to the Diocese together with the bishop, priests and deacons. Consecrated virgins dedicate their prayers to the needs of their Diocese. The image of the Church as the bride of Christ reflects the intimate relationship between Christ and the Church. Consecrated virgins are a sign of the Church as the bride of Christ.

Consecrated virgins are financially independent, and most are employed in secular jobs. Being in a secular society, they are at the forefront of evangelisation. They are the "secret service of the Church".

Until the COVID-19 pandemic emerged, over 700 consecrated virgins from around the world and Australia, were planning to meet in Rome on Pentecost 2020, to celebrate with Pope Francis, the 50th anniversary of the restoration of the rite. We still hope to come together in the future to celebrate with Pope Francis and the Congregation of Consecrated Life and Societies of Apostolic Life.

Still, wherever we are in the world, including myself as the only consecrated virgin in the Diocese of Parramatta, we will join in love and prayer to celebrate this vocation of the Holy Spirit. We will celebrate being the secret service of the Church. We will celebrate being the oldest and newest form of consecrated life in the Church, as we pioneer and break new ground for celibate women in the Church. We will, with your prayers, join in celebration with consecrated virgins from around the world, on this most important anniversary of the Church. Happy Pentecost!
