REFLECTION FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

19th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Along with last week's "Feeding of the 5,000", this week's miracle of Jesus (and Peter) "Walking on Water" is one of the most well-known miracles in the New Testament. I have a book called "The Lost Art of Walking on Water" about the priestly vocation, we see it in movies such as "The Shack", and it is part of some

These miracles are so well known, in part, because of how 'impossible' they are. No one can feed that many people on such meagre quantities of food, nor can people walk on water. Yet these are the stories of Jesus presented to us by Matthew.

These stories have a context, however. Take a closer look at what Jesus himself does: this week he has spent the night in prayer to the Father, last week he had offered the gifts to the Father before distributing them. These miracles take prayer, they take a sense of unity between the Trinity working together. Then, and only then, can the Creator God come and do the 'impossible'.



If we too want to do the 'impossible' we need the same union with God. Peter and the disciples are being battered by the winds; yet in faith, he steps out of the boat - keeping his eyes on Jesus. But loses the connection when he feels the strength of the wind against him. Elijah has been running away from God when God calls him to meet him on the mountain. He does not recognize God in the mighty wind, the earthquake or fire - but only in the sound of a gentle breeze, only then does he go out to converse with God.

There will always be some signs of chaos in our lives, but to subdue it we need to listen and see the eyes of God. We can never do the 'impossible' on our own - Jesus never does the 'impossible' on his own. We need to stay united to God, we need to be close enough to Jesus to look into his eyes with faith and trust.

LET US HEAR AND RECEIVE THE WORD OF GOD

FIRST READING: 1 Kings 19:9,11-13
Go out and stand on the mountain before the Lord God.

When Elijah reached Horeb, the mountain of God, he came to a cave, and spent the night there. Then the word of the Lord came to him, saying, "Go out and stand on the mountain before the Lord, for the Lord is about to pass by."

Now there was a great wind, so strong that it was splitting mountains and breaking rocks in pieces before the Lord, but the Lord was not in the wind; and after the wind an earthquake, but the Lord was not in the earthquake; and after the earthquake a fire, but the Lord was not in the fire; and after the fire a sound of sheer silence.

When Elijah heard it, he wrapped his face in his mantle and went out and stood at the entrance of the cave.

GOSPEL: Matthew 14:22-33

Command me to come to you over the water.

Immediately after feeding the crowd with the five loaves and two fish, Jesus made the disciples get into the boat and go on ahead to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds. And after he had dismissed the crowds, he went up the mountains by himself to pray.

When evening came, he was there alone, but by this time the boat, battered by the waves, was far from the land, for the wind was against them.

And early in the morning Jesus came walking toward them on the sea. But when the disciples saw him walking on the sea, they were terrified, saying, "It is a ghost!" And they cried out in fear. But immediately Jesus spoke to them and said, "Take heart, it is I; do not be afraid."

Peter answered him, "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water." Jesus said, "Come." So Peter got out of the boat, started walking on the water, and came toward Jesus. But when he noticed the strong wind, he became frightened, and beginning to sink, he cried out, "Lord, save me!"

Jesus immediately reached out his hand and caught him, saying to him, "You of little faith, why did you doubt?" When they got into the boat, the wind ceased. And those in the boat worshipped him, saying, "Truly you are the Son of God."

ARRIVING FOR MASS/ VISITING THE CHURCH

Please note, upon your arrival for Mass or visit to the church, you must:

- Register your details (Name and contact number/email) on the sign-on sheets at the entrance.
- Sanitise your hands.
- Maintain social distancing at all times.

After Mass, we ask that during these times, please do not congregate outside.

"On consideration of the most recent NSW Health advice, the <u>Diocese of Parramatta highly recommends all</u> worshippers at Masses in the <u>Diocese to wear a mask</u> to, during and from Mass and other services.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING MASS

- Chairs are spaced out by 1.5m to adhere to social distancing rules. Family members from the same household are allowed to sit together. (You can move the chairs before Mass, and put back after notice 'white spot' markings on the floor).
- Lyrics for hymns are not projected, as congregational singing is discouraged. Musicians will be present with very limited numbers.
- Holy Communion will only be distributed on the hands.
- Shaking of hands during the offering of peace is discouraged.
- Collection plate will not be passed around. A volunteer will walk around each row to collect any donation.
