## Our Lord Jesus, Christ the King

What do you think about when you think of a king? Kings are rulers over people, they often go to war. Kings try to build wealth and power for themselves and their kingdom. Kings are in charge of law and order, the administration of justice. Often in history, because of a fragile ego, one or more of these roles of being a king leads to self-interest and bad decisions and bad behaviour.

Our first and second readings give us a taste of what a good king can bring to people – a vision of eternal glory and sovereignty, a king who restores his people to new life.

Then we have our Gospel reading – this paints a very different picture of a king: this is a king who is to be crucified, shamed, handed over by fellow Jews as a betrayal of truth. No one, then or now, expects this behaviour of a king. Such a fate would surely ruin a kingdom! But this is not how God sees things.



What we have here are two worlds, two kingdoms that come face to face in Jesus and Pilate. On the one side we have this earthly ruler representing the most powerful empire the world had ever seen, a man with economic, political and military power. This is someone to be taken seriously. On the other side Jesus presents a completely different set of value where we are no longer subjects nor slaves but friends. Our relationship with God is restored with God our Creator. This king will rule over, today's Preface says, a "kingdom of truth and justice, a kingdom of holiness and grace, a kingdom of justice, love and peace."

Put like this it seems an easy choice to make – but the truth is that we live six days a week in the first kingdom, and one day we devote to God's kingdom. But ultimately we are asked to choose - to choose with our lives – which king will we follow?

Maitland-Newcastle Bishop Bill Wright dies.



Bishop Wright announced his ill health in September and confirmed he had submitted his resignation as Bishop of Maitland-Newcastle to Pope Francis. He has been bishop of the diocese since June 2011.

Fr Andrew Doohan, vicar general of the Maitland-Newcastle Diocese, said Bishop Wright was "a warm, considered and deeply faithful man" who was "always dedicated to the people of the diocese."

"Bishop Bill was an active and respected member of the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference. He made major contributions to the Church and the wider communities in which he ministered," Fr Doohan said.

Bishop Wright led the diocese during a period when it faced ongoing revelations of historical child sexual abuse that occurred within the diocese and the failures of some of its past leaders to protect children from abuse.

Fr Doohan said the bishop was recognised as an important figure in supporting survivors and introducing reforms to help the Church respond to child sexual abuse

"Bishop Bill recognised the pain of the victims and their families, he acknowledged this and made an abiding commitment to promote the safety, welfare and wellbeing of children and vulnerable adults. Bishop Bill's work to support survivors is part of his legacy," he said.

Funeral details have not yet been finalised.
