REFLECTION FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

20th Sunday in Ordinary Time

CROSSING BOUNDARIES

In the very full account of the episode given by Matthew, the sense of separation of 'holy' Israel from 'unclean' Gentile world emerges with increasing intensity.

Jesus first ignores the woman completely, despite the persistence and force of her plea, as she turns to the Jewish Messiah ('Son of David') for help. The disciples' urgent recommendation, 'Send her away', seems to imply 'Get rid of her by granting her what she wants', but Jesus coldly insists that his mission is restricted to 'the lost sheep of the house of Israel' (cf. 10:5-6). When, in one of the most moving gestures in all the Gospels, she comes and kneels before him and simply begs, 'Lord, help me', all she receives is a third rebuff in the form of the heartless image about not throwing the children's food to doas.

But here, at last, is her chance. With superb wit, she takes up Jesus' image and turns it against him – or at least against the restrictive attitude he is displaying.

Certainly, food prepared for children is not intended for domestic animals. But children eat untidily and house dogs under the table seize any scraps that fall. 'Outwitted', Jesus gives in, agreeing to her request and praising the greatness of her faith.

O WOMAN, **GREAT IS YOUR FAITH!**



Many readers of the Gospel will doubtless be troubled by the apparent coldness that Jesus initially displays towards this desperate person. By depicting him acting in such a way, however, the narrative first intensifies the sense of the barrier between Jews and Gentiles, only to highlight the significance of what is happening when, as a result of the woman's faith, the barrier comes crashing down.

For if their rejection is the reconciliation of the world, what will their acceptance be but life from the dead!

The gifts and the calling of God are irrevocable. Just as you were once disobedient to God but have now received mercy because of their disobedience, so they have now been disobedient in order that, by the mercy shown to you, they too may now receive mercy. For God has imprisoned all in disobedience so that he may be merciful to all.

We ask that you please adhere to the following guidelines for the health and safety of everyone who uses this space.

MAXIMUM CAPACITY

Religious services and funerals = **100** Weddings = **150**

BOOKINGS FOR MASS

Bookings are encouraged for our Sunday Masses. You can do this online via the links on our Facebook page: **HFPMtDruitt** or Parish Website: **www.holyfamily.org.au** You can also register over the phone via: **02 9628 7272**. (You do not need to book for our weekday Masses).

ARRIVING FOR MASS/ VISITING THE CHURCH

Please note, upon your arrival for Mass or visit to the church, you must:

- Register your details (Name and contact number/ email) on the sign-on sheets at the entrance.
- Sanitise your hands.
- Maintain social distancing at all times.

After Mass, we ask that during these times, please do not congregate outside.

"On consideration of the most recent NSW Health advice, the <u>Diocese of Parramatta highly recommends all</u> <u>worshippers at Masses in the Diocese to wear a mask</u> to, during and from Mass and other services.

We understand the inconvenience that masks may pose, but the health of our parishioners and the wider community is our highest concern.

We sincerely thank you for understanding, and for playing your part in keeping our community safe."



WHAT TO EXPECT DURING MASS

- Chairs are spaced out by 1.5m to adhere to social distancing rules. Family members from the same household are allowed to sit together. (You can move the chairs before Mass, and put back after - notice 'white spot' markings on the floor).
- Lyrics for hymns are not projected, as congregational singing is discouraged. Musicians will be present with very limited numbers.
- Holy Communion will only be distributed on the hands.
- Shaking of hands during the offering of peace is discouraged.
- Collection plate will not be passed around. A volunteer will walk around each row to collect any donation.

PLEASE DO NOT ENTER THE CHURCH IF YOU ARE EXPERIENCING COLD OR FLU-LIKE SYMPTOMS. IMMEDIATELY SELF-ISOLATE, MONITOR YOUR SYMPTOMS, AND GET TESTED AS HEALTH OFFICIALS ADVISE.
